Dear Chief Endler:

I am writing to you to inform you of the facts concerning the results of several CVSA examinations conducted by our office during the investigation of the disappearance of Timothy Johnson. On January 26, 2007 Timothy Johnson's family reported him missing. Mr. Johnson lived with, and took care of his invalid mother.

Several family members were suspicious of Mr. Johnson's adopted sister and her boyfriend who had recently moved back into the area. We had no evidence of foul play, but due to these suspicions, we asked the adopted sister and her boyfriend to come in for an interview. After an initial interview both were asked to take a CVSA exam. Both took the exam and failed concerning the disappearance of Mr. Johnson. After being confronted with the results of his exam, the boyfriend confessed that he had been involved in the murder of Mr. Johnson. Once confronted with the results of her exam, the adopted sister also confessed. They admitted that they had killed Mr. Johnson, placed his body in a 50 gal. Drum and filled it with concrete. They had planned on rolling the drum into the Ohio River after they left the interview.

The boyfriend pled guilty to aggravated murder and received 20 years to life. The sister was recently convicted at trial and received 25 years to life. In three hours we solved a crime that I am convinced that, without the CVSA, these two killers would have disposed of the body and never faced justice. The CVSA has proved itself over and over again an invaluable asset to our agency. Thanks for a great tool.
